



PARKticipation: A program for park engagement during the pandemic

With Milwaukee County winters, it is difficult enough to get out in the cold and snowy weather. Add the scourge of COVID-19 and staying in the safe confines of your home becomes even more inviting. For me, it was a battle to get off the couch and get out for a daily walk.

As I bundled up to take on those solo sojourns, I wandered out toward Back Bay Park, up to the Water Tower, over the bridge to Bradford Beach and then trekked through Lake Park for the return trip. These walks opened my eyes to the beauty of the city right outside my door: the trees, wildlife, beaches (with surfers!), historical landmarks and more. I was having fun even bundled and masked!

I'm not sure how the word popped up. It might have started by hearing the Carly Simon song, "Anticipation," in my head. That song served as a conduit to PARKticipation – first the word and then the concept. This, combined with what I was experiencing, became the inspiration to create a program that would encourage others to use our parks during this difficult time.

The Park People, dedicated to park engagement, saw the PARKticipation program as a way to encourage others to experience everything our Milwaukee County Parks offer. The concept was simple. A simple card, like a bingo card, would display a variety of park activities and give people a way to track the activities they completed. Completing a set number of activities would give people the opportunity to earn PARKticipant incentives. The idea took form when the PARKS activity card was created.

The PARKS card is completely free. And, with support through generous sponsors, you can earn prizes. For the winter program, REI, the inaugural sponsor, provided a two-day rental of snowshoes for four people.

Since its launch in January, more than 2,000 people have learned about the program through The Park People's website and social media platforms. The spring version of the program is now underway, and <u>Gift of Wings</u> has generously pledged a number of beautiful kites, windsocks and other items for this season's prizewinners.



Milwaukee Parks Explorer App

While still in development, our Parks Explorer app is a new tool to help park goers learn about and explore our parks. The app provides information about all 157 parks, shows locations of different amenities, includes maps for Forked Aster Trails and so much more. Users can "check-in" at different parks, earn digital badges, take 360 degree park tours, submit photos and use the "time machine" feature to see historical photos. Capital Improvement Project Tracker

Each year, Milwaukee County Parks is assigned funding for capital projects. In 2021, \$8 million was allocated for projects ranging from new playgrounds to parkway and road repairs.

Please note that many capital projects often take many months and even years to complete. Some project highlights include playground reconstructions at several parks, playground surfacing updates at four locations, reconstruction of the north entrance roadway and parking lots at Grant Park, and relocation of flooded segments of the Oak Leaf Trail along the Little Menomonee.
